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COLLECTIVE GLC/ GLIC PRIVATE SECTOR CONTRIBUTION VIA GDRN NOW STANDS AT RM 95.4 MILLION AS IT CONTINUES COORDINATED SUPPORT TO FIGHT COVID-19

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic in Malaysia and as on April 28 2020, several Government-Linked Companies ("GLC"), Government-Linked Investment Companies ("GLIC") and the private sector have **collectively contributed RM 95.4 million** to GLC/GLIC Disaster Response Network (GDRN) and other COVID-19 relief efforts. RM 79.8 million of the total contributions has been used to support the Ministry of Health ("MoH") hospitals to purchase medical supplies and RM 15.6 million has been spent on non-medical related humanitarian aid assistance.

Of the RM 79.8 million, medical supplies worth RM 52.3 million were directly purchased by GDRN member organisations, while medical equipment worth RM 27.5 million was purchased via Pharmaniaga Berhad who coordinated the procurement, warehousing and distribution of these medical supplies to public and institutional hospitals nationwide.

The key highlights of the nature and quantities of medical supplies that was made possible by GDRN members' contributions are as follows:

In addition to the pledge above, several GDRN members had early on implemented several relief support totalling approximately **RM23 million** and these include distribution of food supplies, hygiene kits and medical equipment to hospitals including Pusat Kesihatan Daerah; universities who are still housing students on campus; and to the Surveillance Center that is being managed by the National Disaster Management Agency (NADMA). Several GDRN members have also mobilised their volunteers.

GDRN's commitment to support the fight against COVID-19 will continue beyond the Movement Control Order ("MCO") period as it plans to assist vulnerable and B40 communities who have been impacted by COVID-19 in the longer term. This is in line with the purpose of the GDRN's formation, which is to ensure holistic response in the short, medium and long term in times of disasters as witnessed by its support across the country between 2013 to 2019.
